



Dear Fellow Children of God,

Fall is upon us again which in the church means not only are many of our programs underway again, but our annual stewardship campaign is about to kick off. Having been in ministry for pretty much all of my adult life, I KNOW many people get uncomfortable when churches and pastors start talking about money. Frankly, pastors and churches get uncomfortable too! But the truth is, Jesus talks about money more than any other topic in the Bible, so to avoid the topic would be to avoid a lot of what Jesus had to say. And if the church stays silent on the topic, then the voices of materialism, consumerism, and greed in our culture might be the only ones heard by Christians.

So this fall, you will likely hear a couple of stewardship sermons from me and read a few stewardship articles. These messages from me won't be about meeting a budget. They won't be designed to produce guilt or shame. Rather, they will focus on what it means to be a joyful giver, to live a generous life with our time, talents, and finances, and on how your gifts to our ministry at English Lutheran have and will be used to do God's work.

The fact is, since before we were born, God loved us and was pleased with us. After God created us, God saw what God made, and said we were good. When we claim this truth for ourselves and for all others, we lose any sense of obligation and instead we begin to experience gratitude towards God and a desire to do the work of God's kingdom. I believe, all of our giving, whether to our favorite charity, to our friends or family, or to our church, should flow from this sense of complete gratitude for what God has already done for us through Jesus Christ, and a desire to love the neighbors God has placed on our hearts. This is not about simply "meeting a church budget." It's about faithfully praying for God's guidance how God would have us give, and trusting God to use those gifts to lead us in mission to a world in need of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

So thank you in advance, for all the ways you have been generous with your time, talents and finances in the past, and for beginning a time of prayerful consideration of how God will use your gifts in the year ahead.


Beginning on Sunday, October 6th, you will see a silhouette of our church on the wall as you come up the steps to the sanctuary. You will notice the three cornerstones of our church "God", "Jesus" and "the Holy Spirit". Additionally, you also will see the building blocks of our church depicted as various ministries, i.e. Sunday School, Worship & Music, Youth, Fellowship, Church Council, Women of ELC etc. On top of our church foundation we will add the bricks that build up our church and provide the resources that allow it to grow.

Each of us can help build up our church with one to four bricks by turning in your stewardship commitment card. How you fill it out determines the following;

- 1) **Brick One;** Turn in your commitment card by November 24th.
- 2) **Brick Two;** Indicate you currently volunteer for one of our various ministries or are willing to volunteer in the coming year.
- 3) **Brick Three;** Indicate you are an electronic giver or will sign up for electronic giving for 2020.
- 4) **Brick Four;** Indicate you are increasing your giving from 2019.


Please prayerfully consider participating in this year's Stewardship Campaign to build up our church with as many bricks as we can to support our church now and into the future with the gifts you have received from God.

Community Trick or Treat






Women's Bible Study

Our next gathering will be Monday, October 7, 6:15-8:15 pm


Please join us as we craft together beautiful, handmade quilts for our High School Seniors who will be graduating next May.


Christikon




